Its mission is to facilitate and coordinate the implementation of applied geoscience programmes in East and Southeast Asia in order to contribute to economic development and the improvement of the quality of life in the region. The 11 member states comprises Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. It is supported by 14 Cooperating Countries; Australia, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Japan, The Netherlands, Norway, Russian Federation, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom and United States of America which provide financial and technical input to the organization's activities. CCOP has been acknowledged by its member states and the international society as a vital and successful organization in serving the region for sustainable economic development and will continue to play the role in regional cooperation in geoscience programmes.

PETRAD, the Bridge Group, and the Norwegian Petroleum Directorate will be assisting CCOP in the planning and execution of the CCOP-EPP2002.

CCOP will send a 50-member strong delegation to the event showcasing a joint effort from the Member Countries in promoting the region's oil and gas industry. Open dialogue with the oil industry is critical for countries with petroleum potential wishing to promote development of their petroleum resources. This meeting could then be viewed as a meeting place for future exploration in the East and Southeast Asia region and will provide a cost-effective market place for CCOP Member Countries to promote their oil and gas potentials to the oil industry. It will also give key decision makers the opportunity to get exposed to market realities and provide a forum to address issues of regional and industry wide significance.

- Side Meetings (Member Countries dialogue with the oil industry)
